There has been a theft of oil from a tank in the village already so make sure your tanks are secure. We all know too well how much a tank of oil is worth so if you can secure the tank and or your property, or make the tank more visible, or install an alarm or security light this could deter the thieves.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

At the time of writing there does not appear to have been any specific problems in the village over the last few months.

However, in the South Norfolk Area there are continual instances of individuals involved in distraction burglaries and carrying out inferior work for vastly inflated prices.

Residents are warned to be aware of any cold callers offering to do work. If you require any work to be done on your property make sure it is at your instigation and either use a known tradesman or obtain more than one estimate. A recent scam used the name of May Gurney when the company had no connection whatsoever with this company. The Norfolk Trading Standards would very much like to be informed if you are approached in this manner, their number is 0844 800 8005.

For distraction burglaries, the favourite scam is still to use water board or energy companies. To check authenticity of officials ask for their identity card and ring either Anglian Water on 0800 145 145 or for EDF call 0800 365 000 and make sure you make the person wait outside and lock your doors when making the call.
