### **Parish Meeting and Governance Review**

The role of all Parish Councils in South Norfolk is being reviewed and there is a strong emphasis on saving costs. Our Parish Meeting in March was well attended and there was a clear majority in favour of retaining our independence and control of our own budget. Fortunately two people volunteered to fill the long standing vacancies on the PC and they will offer themselves for co option at the PC meeting on May 8th.

Since Richard Sinclair retired as Clerk in December we have been using a locum clerk (Carole Jowett) for those matters that have to be dealt with by a clerk and will continue to discuss with Hethersett how we can share clerical costs in future. The bulk of the clerk's duties are currently being done by the Chair (with some clerical assistance) as Mrs Jowett is only being paid a minimal retainer. There is an ongoing government requirement to publish more PC information online and there are plans in place to migrate the website to a CMS system in order to facilitate this. In the meantime, the full accounts are online and parishioners are encouraged to read them. There are links on the website homepage to matters discussed in this newsletter and further announcements will be made via the Facebook group which now has 160 members and is well used—see the website for how to join.

The Governance review provides an opportunity to review Parish boundaries and it was agreed at the Parish Meeting to suggest simplifications of our boundaries with Hethersett and Bawburgh—the details of our response will be on the website.

## **Developer contributions**

The new play equipment was made available at the end of March and has proved to be very popular though there are still some installation issues (mainly as a result of the unusually dry weather) to be resolved. The equipment will be paid for by statutory contributions, from the Ringwood and Mill Rd developers, that are specifically for play areas. The PC expects to receive a further £11,600 which has more flexible spending criteria but has to be spent within 5 years for the benefit of the community. Please let us know your suggestions—Traffic Calming and automated detection of infringements of the weight limit zones are possible uses.

County Council Elections on May 4th—Judith Virgo is not standing for re-election and I will take this opportunity to press the candidates on how they will help us to minimize traffic problems in the village as the CC is responsible for Highways matters. Please raise your concerns with the candidates. We thank Judith for her work on our behalf.

**Litter Pick** - Seven people removed 8 sacks of litter from around the village in March. Please come and help at our next pick on October 28th or feel free to borrow the equipment any time you would like to remove some litter!

**Road Closure**—Great Melton Rd will be closed just west from the crossroads between 8th to 19th May, for water mains works.
