#### The end of an era

Richard Sinclair has been our Parish Clerk for over 40 years and retires at the end of 2016. The PC thanks him for his dedication to the village over such a long period! Richard is staying in the village and we hope to see him and others on the next Litter Pick (March 25th - details on notice boards nearer the date and website). District Council wards are changing and in 2019 we will move to the same ward as Hethersett and will have the same District and County councillors. This is a sensible change and we plan to share clerical services with Hethersett, who are currently reviewing their needs in view of their large housing developments. In the meantime the Parish Council will manage with the aid of a locum Clerk, temporary clerical assistance and help from volunteers. People have already come forward to help manage the four notice boards in the village and to process the vehicle speed data as recorded by the speed signs.

#### And the start of a new era

2017 will see the occupation of some houses in the new developments. This will increase the number of houses paying council tax and combined with some reductions in clerical costs will reduce the Parish Precept by 5%. The developers will eventually make a contribution to the Play Area and this is fortuitous because the current equipment is nearing the end of its life and has been repaired over many years by volunteers. The PC has consulted with children at the school and believe that the planned new equipment will meet the needs of a wider age range than at present. It is also hoped to provide a practice goal on additional land behind the tennis court, generously offered by the Evans-Lombe Estate. The Parochial Charity and Community Trust have offered to lend money to the PC, to enable work on the new equipment to start soon.

The Internet had not been invented when Richard started as village Clerk - now everything has to be published online (the Precept and Accounts are available on the PC Duties section of the website). We hope to update the website to Joomla CMS and would appreciate help from volunteers with graphic design and PHP skills.

We want to make PC meetings more accessible to people and will be conducting the official business between 19:30 and 20:00, from 20:00 we will have an open chat about any matters that people wish to raise. We will also be moving back to the Village Hall. The next meeting is on Monday the 9th Jan-please come along if you would like to contribute to the future of the village in any way. Much of the PC business is now conducted online, so we will reduce the number of meetings to six per year. The meeting in March is the annual Parish Meeting which always has been open to all Parishioners. There will be a lot happening during 2017 and we will use the Facebook group (link on the PC website) to issue updates between newsletters.

#### Little Melton Pre-School Nursery

The nursery has enjoyed another busy festive season, especially being part of the church decoration event again this year, and watching the nativity play at the primary school. It is always lovely to feel part of our wider community in the village.



The committee is continuing to plan a lot of fundraising events for the spring - we are in the process of arranging a craft fair at the primary school on Saturday 18th March - look out for the notices around the village! We always really appreciate it when members of our local community come along to support us. Any money raised by these events is totally spent on improving the facilities and activities we offer.

Anyone interested in a place for their child at our nursery is always welcome to pop in for a visit, there is no need to pre-book simply come along when we are open - Term-time - each weekday morning 9.15 to 12.15.

The **repairs to the tower** should be completed. The cost has been met by a grant from The Listed Places of Worship Fund and £10,000.00 raised locally by the friends of Little Melton Church. Our thanks go to both those groups for the help and funding we have received.

The Mid-Norfolk Family History Society has undertaken a survey of the gravestones in the churchyard. A copy has been presented to All Saints. We will be making further copies as soon as possible one of which will be kept in the church for visitors to use.

Shared lunches were enjoyed after the Harvest Thanksgiving and the Remembrance Day services. The sponsored cycle ride raised over £450.00. Throughout the year we have also been providing support to The Ashcroft Project for young people with mental health problems and the Norwich Foodbank as well as donating to refugees in Calais. The 200 decorated jars looked lovely in the church at the busy Christmas period.

On 14<sup>th</sup> January we will be holding our annual Church Quiz in the Village Hall at 7.30. Tickets at £6.00 per person can be bought on the door. We need teams of 8 people, but if you are not in a team they can be made up on the night. Refreshments will be provided but bring your own drink and glasses.
