Governance Review

The PC has submitted its response to the Governance review and parishioners are encouraged to submit their own views before July 12th. Please read the PC response before you respond! The main points of our response were discussed at the Parish Meeting in March and are as follows -

- We welcome cooperation with our neighbours and want to share a Clerk in order to reduce costs
- We want to retain an independent PC to represent our interests—we are now at full strength
- The parish boundaries date back to the medieval and should be reviewed to take into account modern roads and businesses

Parishioners should be aware that 9000 more houses are due to be allocated to the Greater Norwich area —on top of the many thousands already given permission but not yet built. LM will come under pressure to accept some of these houses and it is vital that we retain a strong PC in order to represent our interests. Whilst we now have 7 councillors, we are still a small PC compared to our neighbours and welcome any help that people can give! The PC Chair has been invited to attend a conference, organized by our MP Richard Bacon, that will look at development options. The Chair will point out that little progress appears to have been made on promised infrastructure changes for the local developments that are currently in progress (eg increasing Doctor's surgery capacity, improvements to the B1108, cycle paths). There are also 2 * 2 bed Shared Equity Homes at The Limes, available to purchase for 75% of market value with the owner being able to increase their ownership to 100% after living in the property for 5 years.
